### Winners of first annual Yukon Young Worker Safety Student Video Contest announced

Winners of the first annual Yukon Young Worker Safety Student Video Contest were announced today by the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board.

The contest invited Yukon high school students to submit short videos on the theme "common workplace hazards." In all, 25 entries were received from students in Whitehorse, Dawson City, and Ross River.

Winning entries receive cash prizes ranging from \$300 to \$1,000 for the filmmakers, with matching cash prizes to the supporting school or Skills Canada club. In addition, the two first prize winners will be screened at the 2009 Dawson City International Short Film Festival on Easter weekend.

Prizes will be awarded to the filmmakers and their sponsoring organizations at the Territorial Skills Competition at Yukon College on Friday, April 3, at 4:00 p.m.
