

## **Inter-Jurisdictional First Aid certification agreement**

### **The basics:**

This agreement affects employers and workers who work in more than one jurisdiction.

Starting April 1, 2009 workers with approved First Aid training certificates in any of the five western provinces and Yukon will have those certificates recognized in each jurisdiction.

This agreement is intended to enable labour mobility across the following jurisdictions:

### **The details:**

All jurisdictions have agreed to minimum standards for three levels of workplace First Aid training. In Yukon those levels are:

- Emergency
- Standard
- Advanced

### **Additional responsibilities:**

When a First Aid worker plans to work in another jurisdiction it is the responsibility of that worker and their employer to verify:

- The training certificate is from an approved agency in that jurisdiction.
- The date on the certificate is still current.

The employer is also responsible to ensure workers are competent in applying their jurisdiction's specific legal requirements related to workplace First Aid.

Workers are responsible for learning those legal requirements and being competent in applying them in the jurisdiction in which they are working.
