Education, Career and Volunteer Expo

November 6, 2019 Yukon College

- Sole-proprietor (working at home on computer)
 - What are the benefits to paying Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board (YWCHSB) when one is working in a low risk environment?
- Increase education about what YWCHSB does. This will help people appreciate the benefits of YWCHSB.

Geoscience Trade Show

November 16-17, 2019, Yukon Convention Centre

- Strengthen road access regulations and confined space education;
- Regulations should be easier to read;
- Create rope access regulation;
- Improve fall protection regulation;
- Hazard assessment is outdated; and
- When registering a business with Government of Yukon, the government should notify YWCHSB.

Reverse Trade Show

November 27, 2019, Kwanlin Dün Cultural Centre

- Provide transparent records of fines and complaints of Yukon companies to the public to assist with contract awarding;
- Concerned about technological changes happening faster than regulations being updated;
- Update regulations concerning rope use, confined spaces, working at heights, etc., in light of technological changes with cell towers, windmills, etc.;
- Updating regulations can help improve training and safe work procedures;

- Clarify who is specifically responsible for hazard assessment;
- Strengthen details on hazard assessments;
- Update regulations for cranes and lifts;
- Increase local crane inspections by YWCHSB safety officers;
- Increase safety inspections at remote locations;
- Provide interjurisdictional certificate of recognition (COR) certification, if possible;
- Rope and confined space regulations need updating to reflect overlap;
- Competent person should clearly defined;
- Stand by person should be clearly defined;
- Tougher regulations; and
- New regulations helpful for training and safe practices.
